Lenten services, including Ash Wednesday, will be at 12 noon (with soup served afterwards) and 6:30pm (with pizza etc served prior) starting March 5th.

Thank you, Worship Enhancement Team...our worship space and hallways looked so beautiful during the Christmas season. We know it takes lots of time and energy to make that happen. The poinsettia plants were particularly beautiful and long-lasting - thank you Diane and Tim for tending to them so faithfully.

It is time to "Think Spring" and get ready for the Lent/Easter season. Ash Wednesday is March 5th and Easter Sunday is April 20th. As in the past, we will be enhancing the worship space with flowers for this season. There will be an opportunity to purchase spring flowers - to be used in the sanctuary - in honor of or in memory of special people in your lives. Look for the forms to help with the flowers in early March. They will be on the usher's table and in the office.

DID YOU KNOW...

Along with the paraments, and wall hanging, the mobile above Jacob's well in the narthex changes again for Lent.



Each year, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season of 40 days (excluding Sundays) before Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday focuses the Christian's heart on repentance and prayer, usually through personal and communal confession. The day is named for the practice of imposing ashes, a practice that many Lutheran congregations have found to be a very meaningful part of the Ash Wednesday liturgy. Using ashes as a sign of repentance is an ancient practice, often mentioned in the Bible (e.g., Jonah 3:5-9; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26; Matthew 11:21). The early Christians adopted the use of ashes from Jewish practice as an external mark of penitence. Ashes symbolize several aspects of our human existence:

- Ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin, as God said to Adam, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19).
- Ashes suggest cleansing and renewal. They were used anciently in the absence of soap. Even on Ash Wednesday, this most penitential day, we receive ashes in the form of the cross, the same symbol placed on our bodies with water in our baptism. Even in this ashen mark of death, we anticipate the new life of Easter.
- Ashes remind us of the shortness of human life, for it is said as we are buried into the ground or as ashes are placed in a columbarium. "We commit this body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust" (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 284).
- Ashes are a symbol of our need to repent, confess our sins, and return to God.

The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.

The Lenten season culminates with Holy Week, which includes Palm Sunday and the joyous celebration of Easter. Resource:

Tubman's long and eventful life included being an armed scout and spy during the Civil War and guiding a raid at Combahee Ferry, which liberated more than 700 enslaved people.

LETTER FROM YOUR PASTORS

Your pastors often feel surprised. One would think - with more than a century of life, decades of marriage, parenting, and ministry, and a stack of credentials between us - that we'd know a thing or two. One would think, but one would be wrong. We don't, or at least we feel like we don't. But we've learned that keeping a spirit of curiosity can make a surprise an opportunity for learning and growth, even transformation.



One of the things we're curious about is how members of this congregation have learned to make peace with the past. We've heard some remarkable stories in our years at Atonement about mistakes, hurts, and disappointments that people have decided to learn from and/or lay to rest. Forgiveness and hope flow through this congregation like the blood in our veins, carrying life to each member. We'd like to hear more of these stories, and we have a hunch that you would be glad to hear them, too.

Hurt and disappointment is an unavoidable part of life on this earth. Your pastors consider pain the price we pay for the privilege of loving and being loved, but that doesn't make the hurt less painful when it comes, or healing the hurts of love less hard. If anything, healing the hurts of heart and soul is a minor miracle, which is why we think stories some of you have shared with us about times you have made peace with the past are proof of the Holy Spirit at work among us.

Do you have a story of making peace with a person or group of people, or with an event or series of events, that unsettled your life, that hurt or disappointed you that you'd be willing to share, confidentially or in public? Your pastors would love to hear your story, and if you are willing, help you prepare to share it with our faith community during Lent. In fact, our hope is that we will have enough storytellers come forward that our Lenten theme will be, in fact as well as in name: "Making Peace with the Past"



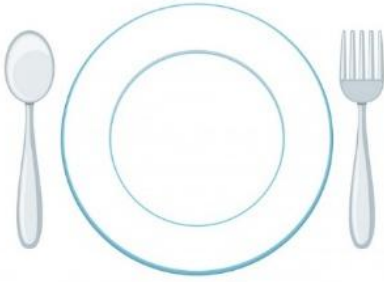
