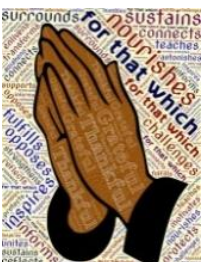

## JOIN CONVERSATION WITH OUR ROMAN CATHOLIC NEIGHBORS

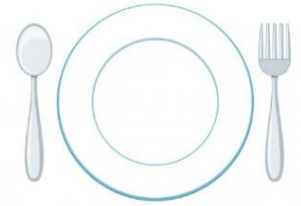

# LETTER FROM YOUR PASTORS

## Making Peace with Ourselves: Reflections on Our Lenten Journey

As Lent gives way to Easter, this is a look back at our Sunday Adult Education series, *Making Peace with Ourselves*. If you missed a week, or want to go back and listen again, the full series is available on the Atonement YouTube channel.



Over five weeks, your pastors took a hard look at some things most of us would rather avoid—the voice inside us that wants to be in charge. At first, that can look like strength. But sooner or later sin rears its ugly head, and it turns on us. It accuses us, replays our failures, makes us feel inadequate, and refuses to let us rest.

When we're honest, that voice sounds a lot like law. It exposes our sin—but it never gives us peace. So, where do you find peace? Instead of turning to self-help ideas or vague spiritual advice, we invited you to consider real people (and in one instance a fictional character with lots of real qualities). Yes, these were remarkable people. They are part of a "great cloud of witnesses" who wrestled with the same inner battles we do, and they learned something we think is valuable while teaching us a path toward peace.

It's easy to turn figures from history, Scripture, or literature into heroes who had it all together. But we discovered that they actually didn't have it all together, that's the point. Scripture is honest about sin, and the characters we considered struggled, just like we do. And, in an imperfect way, figured out how to make peace with those struggles.

Pastor John led us through three of them:

- **Jean Valjean** (*Les Misérables*), who had to learn—painfully—that he was more than his past. The verdict over his life had changed, but he struggled to believe it. Like us, he had to learn to live by a word spoken over him.
- **King David**, who knew what it was to carry guilt he could not fix. When he was confronted, he didn't justify himself. He confessed: "Create in me a clean heart, O God." He threw himself entirely on mercy.
- **Dietrich Bonhoeffer**, writing from a prison cell, admitted the gap between his public strength and private fear. He didn't resolve it by becoming stronger, but by clinging to this: "I am yours, O God." His identity rested outside himself.

I had the chance to share two more modern witnesses:

- **Martin Luther King, Jr.**, sitting at his kitchen table in real fear, came to the end of his own strength. What sustained him was not something within, but a promise from Christ: "I will be with you."
- **Flannery O'Connor**, living with serious illness, refused to pretend that suffering was noble or easy. She understood that grace is not sentimental. It strips away illusions and drives us back to Christ.

Each of their lives were different. But we discovered a similar pattern.



Why carry your sins when God wants to take them away?

They all ran into the same difficult truth we confess every Sunday: we are sinners. As our liturgy suggests, “*we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves.*” Not just occasionally, but deeply – i.e., the “Old Adam” is a fundamental condition of the human heart. Which means we cannot make peace with ourselves by fixing ourselves.

Peace comes another way. It comes from outside of us:

- From the Word of forgiveness spoken in worship.
- From the promises given in baptism.
- From Christ crucified and risen for us.

That is the heart of the Gospel: **not what we do for God, but what God has done for us.**

Now, the culmination of the Christian faith is upon us. This month we are celebrating Easter. This is most certainly good news! We can confidently declare that the peace these witnesses clung to is not unique to them. It is given to us in Christ. The tomb is empty. The work is finished. The verdict has already been spoken!

You are forgiven. You are baptized into Christ. You belong to Him.

That is a peace your inner voice cannot give—and cannot take away.

He is risen! He has risen indeed!

Crisis Nursery staff understand that to provide a safe and nurturing environment at home, there are times when parents need additional support. This confidential and voluntary service is available in four areas in Minnesota.

Parents dealing with personal stress or crises such as an illness, housing problems, divorce or separation, financial strains or other issues can benefit by contacting us.

A child's parent or legal guardian can request:

- Short-term care by licensed providers for children up through age 12.
- Crisis support for families.
- Information and referrals to additional community resources.

Sometimes their nurseries become full. Licensed childcare or foster care homes are needed to share their love, lives and homes with children in need. They can use the following items: \$10 gas cards, Uber gift cards, baby formula, new children's clothing (3T - Size 12).

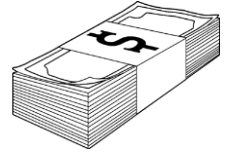
