LETTER FROM YOUR PASTORS

This year the Christian church celebrates the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed developed by the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D.! Sources disagree whether the boy who would become St Martin of Tours was born before or after the Council of Nicaea gave us the original version



of the Nicene Creed in 325 A.D. - and they differ by quite a lot, roughly a decade in either direction. It is, on the other hand, generally agreed that he was born in a province of the Roman Empire (Pannonia) that became modern-day Hungary and grew up in northern Italy, where his father was given land after retiring from his position as tribune in the Roman military.

Martin's family were pagans. This was common at that time in the Roman Empire, especially in rural areas and among the upper and military classes. It was, therefore, much to his parents' displeasure that he snuck off to a Christian worship service at around 10 and was later baptized.

The exact date of Martin's baptism is unknown, but tradition holds it was near the end of his required military service. As the son of a tribune, Martin had been required to join the military as a cavalryman at 15. He served during the reigns of at least two emperors (they didn't often last long), in particular the emperor Julian (361-363 A.D.), often called "Julian the Apostate" by Christian writers, who was a relative of Constantine the Great (the emperor who made Christianity legal in the Roman Empire).

Emperor Julian wanted to restore what he considered the pagan greatness of Rome and to diminish the influence of Christianity (which had been growing since Emperor Constantine's Edict of Milan). He set about doing so almost immediately by reinstating Greco-Roman polytheism as the state religion, among other measures. Martin, who was at that time stationed in modern-day Germany (Gaul) and close to retirement, did not believe he could accept pay from or serve as a soldier in the army of a pagan emperor and so refused to fight. He was arrested and charged with cowardice. In answer to the charges, he volunteered to go unarmed at the front of the troops.

Normally, this kind of situation would spell the end of a Roman soldier who refused to fight, but as providence would have it, the opposing army sued for peace and Martin's superiors decided to let him retire. This was a defining moment for Martin, and he dedicated his life to Christian service, and also served as a bishop in the church. He lived a life of such holiness that he was eventually venerated as a saint.

You can read about that on your own if you're interested. Wikipedia has a decent article about him, which can point you to primary sources. But what your pastors think is so interesting about St. Martin is how God gave him the strength to hold firm to his convictions of what it means to live as a Christian in the world. St. Martin of Tours



demonstrated a Christian faith that chose not to flee or to hide or to compromise when challenged. He also chose not to resort to violence in word or deed, but simply to say "No" when asked or ordered to act or speak in ways incompatible with the law of Christ. He was powerful example of steadfast faith, moral courage, and the strength of non-violent conviction in the face of pressure. His choice to live out his faith authentically, even at great personal risk, without resorting to aggression, is a message that continues to hold relevance today.

2025 BIKE BUILD HOME 500 - JULY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY



Central MN Habitat for Humanity is hosting a **5-day**, 500 km fundraiser, July 8-13 for the purpose of raising money for CMHH.

Saturday, July 12th, is dedicated to Atonement's own Loretta Anderson in honor of her many hours of volunteering on Habitat Home builds and riding in the Bike Builds. We will need volunteers for two rest stops (3

people each), one at Centennial Park in Richmond and at the Lake Wobegon Trailhead in Avon. SUNBEAM CHILDREN'S HOME



In 1992, Atonement's first 3-person mission team went to Sunbeam Children's Home to build a chicken coop. April 30-May 7th, Marcus NBEAM Anderson and Grant Gryzbowski went to assess the current state of Sunbeam. There are currently seven14 year old boys at Sunbeam. Their cost of care is being subsidized by their families until they can

return home. All the boys are in public high schools in Old Harbour or Spanish Town. A new CEO of Child Protection Family Services Agency began last year. Shortly after, all government funding stopped at Sunbeam and they lost 70% of their operating budget.

Sunbeam is in a rebuilding process. Their goal is to produce 50-60% of their income through farm products. The remaining 40% will need to come from donors in the US and Jamaica. The farm will offer diversified production of lettuce, pigs, callaloo, bananas and beans. The biggest income producer will be chicken production with 300 chickens ready for the market after 6 weeks, thereafter in three-week cycles.

Individual donors will be able to support the salaries of the farm manager and her assistant with donations of \$125/week for each employee. \$200 per week is needed for salary support for each caregiver (house mother and house father). There are many other financial needs to build a new income base for Sunbeam.
